It was the worst winter since we took over the hotel in 1998. At that time we booked 6,831 nights and had a 47.3% occupancy rate, and this winter we had just 5,722 nights and a 43.2% occupancy rate.

No employees have been dismissed because of this situation. Bertram reassured the employees of this right at the beginning of the winter season. Our employees were on hand to help us and supported all the decisions we made, for which we are very grateful! And: all employees will come back in the summer. (Note from Bertram: one hand washes the other, doesn't it?)
